RESOLVE, in favor of the Maine School for the Deaf.

---

*Resolved:* That there be and hereby is appropriated to be  
2 paid the Maine School for the Deaf the sum of twenty-two  
3 thousand dollars for the year nineteen hundred eleven, and  
4 the sum of twenty-two thousand dollars for the year nine-  
5 teen hundred twelve, both said sums for maintenance and  
6 running expenses.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Maine School for the Deaf is a public school for the education of the deaf children of Maine, established by an act of the Legislature, March, 1897. There are in attendance 112 pupils, every section of the state being represented. The pupils are given the regular English course and are also taught to speak and read the lips.
