STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the Central Maine Association for the Relief and Control of Tuberculosis.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of one thousand dollars to be paid to the Central Maine
3 Association for the Relief and Control of Tuberculosis for
4 the use of said association for the year nineteen hundred
5 eleven and one thousand dollars for the use of said associa-
6 tion for the year nineteen hundred twelve for the charitable
7 work of said association.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Central Maine Association for the Relief and Control of Tuberculosis is a voluntary association, not incorporated, composed of citizens at Waterville, Fairfield and vicinity, which has been engaged in doing a large amount of work in treating tuberculosis patients. It has so far been supported wholly by private contribution and is not conducted for profit. A specialty is made of treating patients of small means and of doing charity work for patients unable to pay anything. A dispensary is conducted in connection with the institution to which patients may have access free of cost. The work is not local but is extending all over Maine. The association will expend during the next two years at least fifteen thousand dollars. Two-thirds will be paid by private contribution. The state aid asked will not cover the expenses of the charity work done by the association.
