STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the York Hospital.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated for
2 the York Hospital the sum of one thousand dollars for the
3 year nineteen hundred and eleven, and one thousand dollars
4 for the year nineteen hundred and twelve for maintenance.

STATEMENT OF FACTS RELATING TO YORK
HOSPITAL.

The York Hospital is a public institution located in the town of York, and serves a large district in the southwestern part of the state. It consists of two substantial buildings especially adapted to hospital work, and well equipped throughout. It is open all the year and to all persons alike, whether rich or poor.

Of the 96 patients treated last year, there were medical patients 57, surgical 26, obstetrical 8, and out-patients 5. Of all these 43 were charitable. The hospital gave 444 free days to patients.

Of the \$6532.97 expenditure only \$1566.20 was received from patients. The items of receipts were as follows:

The appropriation asked for, \$1500, is the same as was appropriated for this hospital for last year.
