STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the Old Town Hospital.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated to the

- 2 Old Town Hospital the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for
- 3 maintenance and sewer connection for the year nineteen
- 4 hundred and eleven and the sum of one thousand dollars for
- 5 maintenance for the year nineteen hundred and twelve. The
- 6 same to be paid to the treasurer of said institution.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Old Town Hospital is the oldest institution of its kind in the eastern section of Maine. The first patient treated was on the third day of April, 1892, and since that time to the present over six thousand people have received care and medical attendance in the hosiptal. No person has ever been refused admittance because of lack of means to pay for the needed assistance.
