STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to prohibit the removing of waste or packing from
the journal box or boxes of locomotives and railroad cars.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Any person who wilfully and maliciously takes
2 or removes the waste or packing from a journal box or
3 boxes of a locomotive, engine, tender, carriage, coach, car,
4 caboose or truck used or operated upon a railroad, whether
5 operated by steam or electricity, shall be imprisoned for not
6 more than three years or fined not more than five hundred
7 dollars.
