STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the Maine Mission for the Deaf.

Resolved: That the sum of two hundred dollars be appro-2 priated for the year nineteen hundred eleven and two hun-3 dred dollars for the year nineteen hundred twelve to aid in 4 carrying out the purpose of the Maine Mission for the Deaf, 5 and to aid in the support of the aged and infirm deaf of the 6 State of Maine.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

There are in this State several aged and infirm deaf persons who could not be well provided for by the various cities and towns in which they have a residence, and this resolve is to aid the Mission in caring for as many as possible of the worthy aged and infirm deaf persons in New England Home for the Aged and Infirm Deaf mutes in Everett, Mass., or in such places as are adapted to their needs.
