STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to protect striped or sea bass, in the waters of the
Sheepscot River and its tributaries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for or catch striped
2 or sea bass in the waters of the Sheepscot river and its tribu-
3 taries in any manner except by hook and line, between Feb-
4 ruary 15 and December 31 in each year.

Sect. 2. Any person convicted of fishing or catching
2 striped or sea bass contrary to the provision of section 1 of
3 this act shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dol-
4 lars nor more than twenty-five dollars, by complaint or
5 indictment, one-half to the use of the complainant and one-
6 half to the county. Full jurisdiction to impose such fine is
7 hereby conferred upon trial justices.
