STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section eighty-nine of chapter ninety-four of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and nine, relating to the compensation of selectmen.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. Eighty-nine of chapter ninety-four of the Pub2 lic Laws of nineteen hundred and nine is hereby amended
3 by appending the following words: 'and towns having less
4 then three thousand inhabitants, may by major vote at its
5 annual town meeting fix the compensation of the chairman
6 of its board, allowing such sum for his services as are com7 mensurate with the duties of the office,' so that as amended,
8 said section shall read as follows:

'Sect. 89. If any town does not choose assessors, or if 10 so many of them refuse to accept that there are not such a 11 number as the town voted to have, the selectmen shall be 12 the assessors and each of them shall be sworn as an as-13 sessor and each selectman and assessor shall be paid for 14 his services, two dollars for every day necessarily and actu-15 ally employed in the services of the town. Towns having 16 three thousand or more inhabitants may vote to pay their 17 selectmen a compensation not exceeding five dollars a day 18 for time actually spent in the service of the town, and towns 19 having less than three thousand inhabitants may, by major 20 vote at its annual town meeting fix the compensation of its 21 board of selectmen, allowing such sum as may be commen-22 surate with the duties of the office.'
