STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to further amend chapter four of the Revised Statutes as amended by chapter seventy-eight of the Public Laws of 1905, relating to town and city by-laws and ordinances.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 4 of the Revised Statutes as amended
2 by chapter 78 of the Public Laws of 1905 is hereby further
3 amended by striking out the word "five" in paragraph twelve
4 and inserting therefor the word 'one' so that said paragraph
5 as amended shall read as follows:

'12. Cities and all towns of more than one thousand in-7 habitants may establish and adopt by-laws and ordinances 8 regulating the purchase and sale of articles usually bought 9 of old junk dealers and dealers in second-hand articles, and 10 the pawning of articles with pawn-brokers, and may there-11 in prescribe conditions to be observed by buyers and sellers, 12 pawners and pawnbrokers, to prevent or detect the sale or 13 purchase of stolen goods; and suitable penalties may be pre-14 scribed in such by-laws and ordinances.'
