STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Norway.

Resolved, That the sum of thirty-two dollars be and hereby 2 is appropriated to be paid to the town of Norway to reim-3 burse said town for money expended in support of John 4 Fugere, a state pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This resolve is to reimburse the town of Norway for board furnished John Fugere, a state pauper, from January 23 to March 20, 1909. Said pauper was aided by the town of Norway in 1908, for which aid the town was regularly reimbursed by the state. During the time covered by the bill for which this resolve was drawn, the board of selectmen of the town of Norway changed, and the incoming selectmen through lack of knowledge of the fact that Fugere was a state pauper and that the bill for his support must be presented within a limited time, neglected to call upon the state within the year 1909.
