STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Waltham.

Resolved, That there be and there is hereby appropriated
2 the sum of one hundred and seventeen dollars to reimburse
3 said town for construction of state road in the year 1909.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Waltham raised for the construction of state road for the year 1909, the sum of \$58.50, entitling said town to \$117.00 from the state, when properly expended. It expended over \$180.00 on the piece of state road for that year, but has never been paid by the state, owing to a misunderstanding in relation to a culvert built therein.

The piece built was about 300 feet long, 150 feet of which has a large stone drain in the center covered with dirt, then finished with a heavy coat of gravel, and the balance is the same without the drain, there being no necessity for it. The stone drain extends to the culvert.

The culvert is laid up with heavy stone, and covered with stone, the vent being about $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet square and 20 feet long. But this not being in accordance with the specifications in relation to being laid up in cement, was not accepted by the inspector.

It is a good substantial piece of road, including the culvert, which is at one end of it, and the same as all our other state road.
