STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the erection of a suitable monument to Commodore Samuel Tucker.

Resolved, The statue of a soldier upon the monument 2 erected to the memory of Commodore Samuel Tucker un-3 der the provisions of Chapter 243 of the Resolves of 1909 4 is hereby presented to the town of Bremen for use elsewhere 5 as a soldiers' monument or otherwise as said town may 6 determine.

The sum of seven hundred dollars is hereby appropriated 8 to be expended by the Governor and Council for the erection 9 upon said monument of a statue which shall suitably common memorate the services of Commodore Samuel Tucker.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

A monument to Commodore Samuel Tucker, erected by the State, was placed in the burying ground where his remains lie in the town of Bremen, last year. There is dissatisfaction that a statue of a soldier surmounts the monument. The appropriation recommended herewith is to defray the expense of making such change as the Governor and Council may deem proper and advisable.
