To the amount reported by the Auditor should be added \$348,-247.58 for unpaid bills of 1910, reported to the Legislature since January 1, 1911, making the total net debt of Maine as nearly as can be ascertained by this committee on January 1, 1911, \$2,554,708.26.

It may be that a further and fuller investigation than it is possible to make at the present time would disclose other liabilities than those which have been presented to the committee. But the committee believes this statement to be at least approximately correct. Comparing the net debt of the State on January 1, 1911, with the net debt on January 1, 1909, it will be seen that during the preceding two years the expenditures of the state exceeded its revenue by \$1,367.382.11.

It is imperative that some provision should be made by this Legislature for taking care of a large portion of the State's liabilities. Those liabilities consist in part of current unpaid bills amounting to \$348,247.58 and of unpaid warrants amounting to \$384,644.75, a total in these two items of \$732,892.33. These amounts are due now and should be paid at once; in fact many of them ought to have been paid long ago.

Entirely aside from this \$732,892.33 the State owes a temporary loan of \$300,000.00 which should be taken care of during the present administration, thus making it necessary for this Legislature to provide revenues sufficient to meet more than \$1,000,000.00 in excess of the expenditures authorized by it.

It is not a part of this committee's duty to make any suggestions to the Legislature with regard to raising revenue or curtailing expenses. Neither is it a part of our duty to make any comment upon the honesty or fidelity of any public officer who has appeared before us or to criticise business methods employed by any of the state departments or institutions. The commit-

tee does recommend, however, that the fuller investigation of state affairs proposed in the joint order recently passed by the Legislature be undertaken, and because of the extreme variance between the statement presented by this committee and that presented in the annual report of the State Treasurer, the committee deems it proper to state that the statement of liabilities in the State Treasurer's report is wholly inaccurate and admittedly incorrect.

The committee presents herewith a full stenographic report of the evidence taken before it.
