AN ACT to confirm the organization of the Farmington Power  
Company and amend its charter extending its corporate pow-  
ers and purposes.

---

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. The proceedings of the incorporation and or-  
2 ganization of the Farmington Power Company are hereby  
3 confirmed and made valid.

Sect. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to acquire  
2 by contract and conveyance from C. O. Sturtevant all the  
3 property, rights, franchises and privileges of the Farming-  
4 ton Electric Company used in supplying electricity in said  
5 town of Farmington and now held by said C. O. Sturtevant,  
6 and on such purchase and conveyance from said C. O. Sturte-

7 vant it shall succeed to and enjoy all such property, fran-  
8 chises, rights and privileges of said Farmington Electric  
9 Company; and the issue of bonds by said Farmington Elec-  
10 tric Company and the conveyance of all said property, rights,  
11 franchises and privileges of said Farmington Electric Com-  
12 pany to said C. O. Sturtevant are each hereby ratified and  
13 confirmed.

Sect. 3. Said Farmington Power Company is hereby au-  
2 thorized to make, generate, buy, sell, distribute and supply  
3 gas and electricity for lighting, heating, manufacturing and  
4 mechanical purposes and power in the towns of Farming-  
5 ton and New Vineyard, with all the rights and powers and  
6 subject to all the duties and liabilities of similar corporations  
7 organized under the general laws of this state.
