STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to consolidate the management of the State Juvenile
Institutions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The government of the State School for Boys
2 at South Portland and the Maine Industrial School for Girls
3 at Hallowell, is hereby vested in a board of trustees, who
4 shall be known as "Trustees of Juvenile Institutions."

Sect. 2. Said board shall be composed of the Governor,
2 *ex-officio*, and of two men and two women, inhabitants of
3 this state, who shall be appointed by the Governor. The
4 term of the trustees first appointed shall be fixed at four,
5 three, two and one years respectively, and the trustees there-
6 after appointed shall hold office for four years.

Sect. 3. Said board shall perform all the duties required,
2 and have all the powers given by statute to the Trustees of
3 State School for Boys and Trustees of Maine Industrial
4 School for Girls and said last named boards are hereby
5 abolished.

Sect. 4. Said trustees shall receive as compensation five
2 dollars a day for time actually employed, and necessary trav-
3 elling expenses, to be audited by the State Auditor.

Sect. 5. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith
2 are hereby repealed.
