STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate the hunting of mink, sable, fisher, otter and muskrat.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. Whoever, between April first and October
2 twentieth of each year, kills or destroys any mink, sable,
3 fisher or otter, forfeits ten dollars for each animal killed
4 or destroyed.

Sect. 2. Whoever, between May fifteenth and October 2 twentieth of each year, kills or destroys any muskrat for-3 feits ten dollars for each animal killed or destroyed; pro-4 vided, however, that it shall be lawful at any time to kill 5 muskrats in Lily pond, in the towns of Rockport and Cam-6 den, and also such muskrats as interfere at any time with

7 the operation and maintenance of any canal, ditch, lawful 8 dam or cranberry bog; provided, further, that this act shall 9 not modify or repeal any Private or Special acts relating 10 to the hunting of muskrats which are now in force.

Sect. 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this 2 act are hereby repealed.
