### STATE OF MAINE

# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate the sale and purchase of game birds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No ruffed grouse, commonly called partridge,
2 woodcock, woodduck, dusky duck, commonly called black
3 duck, teal or any and all ducks known as gadwall or gray
4 duck, mallard, widgeon or baldpate, shoveler, pintail or sprig
5 tail, redhead, scaup duck or greater bluebill, lesser scaup
6 duck or lesser bluebill, golden eye or whistler, bufflehead,
7 ruddy duck or broadbill shall be bought or sold at any time
8 by any person. Provided, however, that the provisions of
9 this section shall not apply to game birds raised in
10 private game preserves operated under permission of the
11 Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 2 be subject to a penalty of not less than five dollars nor more 3 than ten dollars and costs for each bird bought, sold or had 4 in possession in violation of any provision of this act.
