STATEMENT OF FACTS ACCOMPANYING RESOLVE
IN FAVOR OF ROAD FROM THE FORKS TO MOXIE
STATION. (HOUSE DOCUMENT 311).

STATE OF MAINE

The road from the Forks to Moxie Station was built in 1907, and connects with the new extension of the Somerset Railroad.

It is the only thoroughfare leading from the Portland, Waterville and Quebec road between Moscow and Jackman, a distance of 53 miles.

The road was built by the county and The Forks Plantation; it runs through low land a good part of the way, and in the spring and fall is almost impassible. There are two mail stages each day over this road, except Sundays.

All the passengers from this part of the county going to or from the train, as well as all incoming and outgoing freight, are traveling over this road.
