STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section 23, Chapter 125 of the Revised Statutes relating to the sale of tickets to religious or temperance campmeetings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 23 of Chapter 125 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the word meetings in the ninth line of said Section, the following words: and to sell tickets for admission to such meetings,' so that said Section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 23. On application of the presiding elder, officers or preachers in charge, or tent masters, of a religious or temperance camp-meeting in any town, the municipal officers thereof or a majority of them, shall in writing, appoint one or more police officers to preserve the peace during

11 such meeting, who may arrest any violator of the preced-
12 ing Section, detain him until a warrant can be issued, and
13 execute such warrant when directed to them; and the pre-
14 siding officer or committee or arrangements of such re-
15 ligious assembly or meeting may appoint some suitable per-
16 sons to keep boarders and seel refreshments at such meet-
17 ings, and to sell tickets for admission to such meetings, who
18 shall conform therein to such regulations as the officers
19 appointing them prescribe.
