STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter fifty-seven of the
Revised Statutes, relating to organization of Corporations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of Chapter fifty-seven of the Re-
vised Statutes as amended by Chapter seventy-two of the
Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five, and as further
amended by Chapter sixty-seven of the Public Laws of
nineteen hundred and seven, is hereby further amended by
inserting after the word "club" in the thirteenth line the
words 'a lodge of Knights of Pythias,' so that said Section
as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. When seven or more persons desire to be in-
corporated as proprietors of a social, military, literary,
scientific or county law library; as a masonic lodge or

13 consisting of members of different orders or degrees; as a
14 lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows; as a
15 division of the Sons of Temperance; as a tent of the
16 Rechabites; as a grange of Patrons of Husbandry; as
17 a Grand Army Post; as a relief or benefit association for
18 mutual assistance; as a monument or memorial associa-
19 tion; as a society to promote temperance; as a village
20 improvement society; as an association for the promotion
21 of good municipal government; as a yacht club, a lodge
22 of the Knights of Pythias, or for any literary, scientific,
23 musical, charitable, educational, social, military, agricultur-
24 al, moral, religious or benevolent purpose; they may apply
25 in writing to any justice of the peace in the county, who
26 may issue his warrant, directed to one of said applicants,
27 requiring him to call a meeting thereof at such time and
28 place as the justice may appoint.'
