IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Sandy Stream, so called, a tributary to Moxie Pond, in the County of Somerset.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be lawful to fish in Sandy stream, so  
2 called, a tributary to Moxie pond, in the county of Somer-  
3 set, in accordance with the general law of the state; pro-  
4 vided, however, that it shall be unlawful for any person to  
5 take, catch or kill any trout in said Sandy stream less than  
6 six inches in length; it shall also be unlawful for any person  
7 to have in possession any trout less than six inches in length  
8 taken from said Sandy stream.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall  
2 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general

3 law of the state for the illegal taking, catching or killing of  
4 trout and land-locked salmon.

Sect. 3. All acts or parts of acts, whether public or private  
2 and special, inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

Sect. 4. In all prosecutions arising under this act, municipi-  
2 pal and police courts and trial justices within their respective  
3 counties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent  
4 jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts,  
5 and all fines, forfeitures and penalties recovered by any  
6 person for any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith  
7 by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer.
