STATE OF MAINE

For the information of the committee when considering Resolve in aid of navigation on Rangeley, Mooselookmeguntic and Cupsuptic Lakes, I will state that we have done practically all of the work on Rangeley Lake and have received from the State,

for which we have made and placed 18 buoys, all of which have to be re-set and painted after the ice is out each spring and five or six have to be replaced each year. We have also maintained one large light on Rangeley wharf and much of our work has been cleaning out hidden and dangerous logs from the channel.

We have each season done a considerable amount of this work in addition to what the State has paid for. Last season we did such work amounting to about \$100 more than our bill to the State, and steamboat inspectors expected to allow us the amount until late in the season they found it necessary to expend a larger amount than expected on the other lakes and advised us that \$95 was all available in 1910 for maintaining lights, buoys and other work on Rangeley Lake.
