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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

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AN ACT to further amend Chapter three hundred and fifty-  
two of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred  
and five, relating to Caribou Municipal Court.

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*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Section two of Chapter three hundred and  
2 fifty-two of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hun-  
3 dred five, as amended by Chapter four hundred forty of  
4 the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred seven,  
5 and further amended by Chapter three hundred and fifty-  
6 seven of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred  
7 nine, is hereby further amended by striking out in the  
8 eighteenth line the words "one hundred," and inserting in  
9 place thereof the words 'two hundred,' so that said section as  
10 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 2. Said court shall consist of one judge, who shall  
12 be a member of the bar of this state, who shall be appointed  
13 in the manner and for the term provided by the constitution  
14 of this state, and he shall be, ex-officio, a justice of the peace  
15 for the state. The said judge shall enter or cause to be  
16 entered on the docket of said court all civil and criminal  
17 actions, with full minutes of the proceedings in and disposi-  
18 tion of the same, which docket shall be at all times open to  
19 inspection; and he shall perform all other duties required  
20 of similar tribunals in this state. Said court shall have a  
21 recorder, who shall be an attorney at law and be appointed  
22 by the governor, and who shall hold his office for four  
23 years. He shall be sworn by said judge, and keep the  
24 records of said court when requested to do so by said judge.  
25 In case of the absence from the court room or sickness of  
26 the judge, or when the office of judge shall be vacant, the  
27 recorder shall have and exercise all the powers of said judge,  
28 and perform all the duties of said judge by this act, receiv-  
29 ing as compensation the sum of two hundred dollars, to be  
30 paid quarterly from the treasury of the county of Aroos-  
31 took; and the signature of the recorder as such, shall be  
32 sufficient evidence of his right to act instead of the judge;  
33 and copies of the records of said court, duly certified by the  
34 judge or recorder thereof, shall be legal evidence in all  
35 courts of this state.'
