## STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Rose J. Bubier, of Lewiston.

Resolved: That there be paid to Rose J. Bubier, widow 2 of the late John D. Bubier of Lewiston, Maine, the sum of 3 eight dollars (\$8.00) per month, payable quarterly from 4 the fund appropriated for Military pensions, and to begin 5 April 1st, 1911.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

John D. Bubier was a member of the State Militia, and in 1887, was accidently shot in the head, in a Rifle Range in Lewiston, while practicing for a tournament. He did not apply for a pension until 1905. At that time he was granted \$12.00 per month. His widow has no property and is in feeble health, and asks for a pension.

Mr. John D. Bubier died Dctober 2nd, 1910.
