AN ACT to regulate the transportation of trout, togue, land-locked salmon, white perch, black bass and game birds.

•

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Any resident of this State who has lawfully  
2 in his possession one trout, one togue, one land-locked sal-  
3 mon, or one white perch, or one black bass, or ten pounds  
4 of either kind of these fish, or one pair of game birds, may  
5 send the same anywhere in this state without accompanying  
6 the same, by purchasing of the duly constituted agent there-  
7 for a tag, paying for a trout, togue, land-locked salmon or  
8 black bass, one dollar for each, or one dollar for each ten  
9 pounds of the same, and fifty cents for one white perch or

10 ten pounds of the same and fifty cents for a pair of game  
11 birds.

Any person not a bona fide resident of this state and ac-  
13 tually domiciled therein who has lawfully in his possession  
14 one trout, one togue, one land-locked salmon, or one white  
15 perch, or one black bass, or ten pounds of either kind of  
16 these fish, or one pair of game birds, may transport the same  
17 to his home or to any hospital in this state without accom-  
18 panying the shipment, by purchasing of the duly constituted  
19 agent therefor a tag, paying for a trout, togue, land-locked  
20 salmon or black bass, one dollar for each, or one dollar for  
21 each ten pounds of the same, and fifty cents for one white  
22 perch or ten pounds of the same and fifty cents for a pair  
23 of game birds.

Provided, however, that no person shall, under any of these  
25 provisions, send more than one box of fish or one pair of  
26 game birds once in thirty days.

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this  
2 act are hereby repealed.
