STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate the taking of black bass in Pennesseewassee lake and in the Bog, so-called, in the town of Norway, in the county of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person in any one
2 day to take, catch, or kill more than ten black bass in Penn-
3 esseewassee lake or in the Bog, so-called, in the town of
4 Norway, in the county of Oxford. It shall also be unlaw-
5 ful for any person to have in possession any black bass
6 taken in violation of this section.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more

3 than fifty dollars and costs, or by imprisonment not exceed-
4 ing thirty days, for each offense.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act municipi-
2 pal and police courts and trial justices within their respec-
3 tive counties shall have, upon complaint, original and con-
4 current jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior
5 courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties recovered by
6 any person for any violation of this act shall be paid forth-
7 with by the person receiving the same to the state treas-
8 urer.
