STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to extend the open season for fishing for land-locked salmon, trout, and togue, in Great pond and in Long pond, in Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. In addition to the open season now provided
2 by law during which it shall be lawful to fish for land-
3 locked salmon, trout and togue, in Great pond, so-called,
4 and in Long pond, so-called, said ponds being part of the
5 Belgrade Chain of Lakes, so-called, in the County of Ken-
6 nebec, it shall be lawful to fish only with artificial flies or
7 by the method known as fly fishing in said Great pond and
8 in said Long pond from September 15th of each year to
9 October first following, for land-locked salmon, trout and
10 togue, in accordance with the general law of the state.

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this
2 act are hereby repealed.
