STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter three hundred and sixty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eightynine, entitled, "An Act regulating the appointment of the members of the police force of the city of Bangor."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 1. Sections five and six of chapter three hundred

- 2 and sixty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen
- 3 hundred and eighty-nine are hereby amended by striking out
- 4 all of said sections and inserting the following:

'Sect. 5. In the month of June annually the chief of po-6 lice shall select from those members of the police force 7 who have served at least one year continuously prior to such 8 selection, one member of the force to be a deputy chief of 9 police, one member to be inspector of police, three or more 10 members to be captains of police and there or more mem11 bers to be sergeants of police, each to hold office for the
12 following year and until reappointed or relieved by the ap13 pointment of another in his place.

'Said appointments to be subject to confirmation by the 15 municipal officers of said city.

'Sect. 6. The chief of police of said city of Bangor shall 17 be appointed by the mayor of said city, and shall hold office 18 during his pleasure.

'Any person who at the time of his election as chief of 20 police of said city of Bangor is a regular member of the 21 police force of said city, may at the termination of his term 22 of office as chief of police be appointed to his former posi-23 tion as a member of said police force. All acts of parts of 24 acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.'
