STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Chapter nine of the Revised Statutes relative to the property of public municipal corporations situated outside their corporate limits.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Sub-Section one of Section six of Chapter

2 nine of the Revised Statutes of Maine is hereby amended by

3 adding after the word "uses" at the end of said sub-section

4 the following: 'If located within the corporate limits and

5 confines of such public municipal coporation, and also the

6 pipes, fixtures, hydrants, conduits, gate-houses, pumping

7 stations, reservoirs, and dams used only for reservoir pur
8 poses, of public municipal corporations engaged in supply
9 ing water, power and light, if located outside of the limits

10 of such public municipal corporations,' so that said Section
11 as amended will read as follows:

'Sect. 6. The following property and polls are exempt 13 from taxation:

1. The property of the United States and of this State and the property of any public municipal corporation of 16 this state appropriated to public uses if located within the 17 corporate limits and confines of such public municipal cor-18 poration, and also the pipes, fixtures, hydrants, conduits, 19 gate-houses, pumping stations, reservoirs, and dams used 20 only for reservoir purposes, of public municipal corpora-21 tions engaged in supplying water, power and light if located 22 outside of the limits of such public municipal corporations.'
