STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT relating to evidence in personal injury cases.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. In all actions brought to recover damages for
2 personal injuries to or death of a person it is not necessary
3 to allege or prove that the person so injured or killed was in
4 the exercise of due care at the time of such injury or death;
5 and if the negligence of the person so injured or killed is
6 relied upon in defense of the action, such negligence shall be
7 pleaded.
