STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate the hunting and killing of gray squirrels.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. There shall be an annual close time for gray
2 squirrels, in which it shall be unlawful to hunt, chase, catch,
3 kill or have them in possession, except alive, from the first
4 day of November of each year to the first day of Septem-
5 ber of the following year. Whoever violates any provision
6 of this section shall be subject to a penalty of not less than
7 five dollars nor more than ten dollars and costs for each
8 gray squirrel killed or had in possession, except alive, in
9 close time. Provided, however, it shall be unlawful to hunt,
10 chase, catch, or kill any gray squirrel at any time within the
11 limits of any city, village, private or public park or water
12 district within this state.
