STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to provide a close time on wood ducks, so-called.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to hunt, chase, catch, kill,
2 destroy or have in possession at any time, whenever or how-
3 ever killed, any wood duck, so-called, for a period of four
4 years from the time this act takes effect, under a penalty of
5 not less than five dollars nor more than ten dollars and costs
6 for each wood duck unlawfully killed, caught, chased or
7 had in possession.

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this
2 act are hereby repealed.
