STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate the sale and purchase of trout, land-locked salmon, togue, white perch and black bass.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No trout, land-locked salmon, togue, white
2 perch or black bass, shall be sold at any time by any person.
3 No trout, land-locked salmon, togue, white perch or black
4 bass shall be bought at any time by any person. Provided,
5 however, that the provisions of this section shall not apply
6 to trout, land-locked salmon, togue, white perch or black
7 bass raised in private fish ponds operated under permission
8 of the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more

3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense, and an addi-
4 tional penalty of one dollar for every fish sold, bought or
5 had in possession in violation of any provision of this act.

Sect. 3. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this
2 act are hereby repealed.
