STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend an Act relating to the Police court for the
City of Rockland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter three hundred and sixty-eight of the
2 Private and Special Laws of the year nineteen hundred and
3 nine is hereby amended by striking out the words "said
4 city" in the fifth line of section one and inserting in place of
5 the same words 'Knox County', so that said section as
6 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 1. There is hereby established in the city of Rock-
8 land, a court to be denominated the police court for the city
9 of Rockland, to consist of one judge, who shall be appointed,
10 commissioned and qualified in the manner provided by the

11 constitution of this state, and be a citizen of Knox county.
12 and so continue while he remains in office. Also one re-
13 corder who shall be a citizen of Knox county, to be ap-
14 pointed by the governor, by and with the consent of the
15 council, commissioned and qualified in the manner provided
16 by law. Said police court shall be a court of record with a
17 seal to be affixed to all original processes issued therefrom.
18 The present judge shall continue in office until the end of
19 the term, for which he was appointed.'
