AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter eighty-four of the  
Revised Statutes, relating to order of notice by the Supreme  
Judicial Court.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Section one of chapter eighty-four of the Re-  
vised Statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end there-  
of the following: 'and any order or notice that the court may  
grant may be ordered by a justice in vacation', so that said  
section as amended shall read as follows: 'no action can be  
entered after the first day of the session of the Supreme  
Judicial Court without special permission. When it ap-  
pears that the defendant has not had sufficient notice, the

9 court may order such further notice as it deems proper.  
10 Any justice of the Supreme Judicial or of either superior  
11 court may order notice concerning any court proceeding in  
12 or out of term time, directing how it shall be given ; and such  
13 order, when made in vacation, shall be indorsed on the pro-  
14 cess. And any order or notice that the court may grant  
15 may be ordered by a justice in vacation.'
