STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section 1 of Chapter 412 of the Private and Special Laws of 1907, as amended by Section 1 of Chapter 121 of the Private and Special Laws of 1909, regulating fishing in Swift river and its tributaries, in the county of Oxford and in the county of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 1 of chapter 412 of the Private and
2 Special Laws of 1907, as amended by section 1 of chapter
3 121 of the Private and Special Laws of 1909, is hereby
4 amended by striking out the word "Monday" in the eighth
5 line of said section, as amended, and by striking out the word
6 "and" after the word "June" in the ninth line thereof, and
7 by inserting after the word "July" in the ninth line thereof

8 the words 'and August', so that said section, as amended,
9 shall read as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
11 kill any kind of fish at any time in Swift river, so-called, or
12 in any of the streams tributary thereto, situated in Rumford,
13 Mexico, Roxbury, Byron and Plantations D and E, in the
14 counties of Oxford and Franklin, including Swift river pond,
15 except that it shall be lawful to fish in accordance with the
16 general law of the state in the river itself and in any of its
17 tributaries on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday of each
18 week during the months of May, June, July and August of
19 each year. And no person shall catch, take, or kill over
20 thirty-five fish of lawful size in any one day from any or all
21 of these waters, under a penalty of one dollar for each and
22 every fish caught or killed in excess of said thirty-five.'
