STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Chapter 80 of the Revised Statutes of 1903,
as amended by Chapter 117 of the Private and Special Laws
of 1905, relating to the expenses of the County Commissioners
of Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty-two of Chapter eighty of the
2 Revised Statutes of nineteen hundred and three is hereby
3 amended by adding to the clause relating to Cumberland
4 County, the following words, 'and also all actual cash ex-
5 penses incurred in the management of the county farm' after
6 the word "business" in the eighth line of said section, so that
7 said section as far as relates to said Cumberland county shall
8 read as follows:

'The chairman of the county commissioners of the county of
10 Cumberland shall receive ~~the~~ the sum of ten hundred and fifty
11 dollars and each of the other commissioners shall receive the
12 sum of nine hundred and fifty dollars annually, payable from
13 the county treasury, in quarterly payments, on the first days
14 of April, July, October and January, in full for all services,
15 expenses and travel, including the management of the jail
16 workshop and the sale of its products, except actual necessary
17 cash expenses incurred outside of the county for the transac-
18 tion of official business, and also all actual cash expenses
19 incurred in the management of the county farm; all bills for
20 such expenses shall be approved by the clerk of courts and
21 county attorney of said county; at least a majority of said
22 board shall be in attendance at their office in Portland on all
23 secular days except when official business calls them else-
24 where.'
