STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to extend the provisions of Chapter three hundred
and fifteen of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hun-
dred and nine, being "An Act to incorporate the Penobscot
Bay Water Company." to March 26, 1913, and to amend said
chapter.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter three hundred and fifteen of the Pri-
2 vate and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and nine, being
3 "An Act to incorporate the Penobscot Bay Water Com-
4 pany," is hereby extended to March 26, 1913.

Sect. 2. Strike out the words "except Goose pond and its
2 outlet situated in the towns of Searsport, Frankfort and
3 Swanville or" in the fourth, fifth and sixth lines of said

4 section, and insert in its place the following: 'Provided, that
5 said company shall not take water from Goose pond in the
6 town of Searsport, Frankfort and Swanville or the outlet
7 streams of said pond until said company shall have obtained
8 the written consent of all the owners of water power privi-
9 leges located on said stream and,' so that said section shall
10 read as follows:

'Sect. 2. Said company for said purposes may retain,
12 store, collect, take, use, and distribute water from springs
13 except such springs as are in actual use for domestic pur-
14 poses, ponds, streams and other water sources in said Sears-
15 port. Provided that said company shall not take water
16 from Goose pond in the town of Searsport, Frankfort and
17 Swanville, or the outlet of said pond until said company shall
18 have obtained the written consent of all of the owners of
19 water power privileges located on said stream; and from
20 Boyd pond in the town of Stockton Springs and Prospect;
21 and may locate, construct and maintain cribs, reservoirs,
22 aqueducts, gates, pipes, hydrants and all other necessary
23 structures therefor.'
