STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section three of chapter one hundred twentynine of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter forty of the Public Laws of 1905, and chapter one hundred forty-four of the Public Laws of 1909.

Bc it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section three, chapter one hundred twenty-nine

of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter forty of the

Public Laws of 1905, and chapter one hundred forty-four of

the Public Laws of 1909, is hereby amended by striking out

all of the first of said section, to and including the word

dollars," in the tenth line thereof, and substituting in place

thereof as follows: 'Whoever by himself, clerk, servant or

agent, sells, exchanges or delivers, or has in his custody or

9 possession with intent to sell, exchange or deliver or exposes 10 or offers for sale or exchange adulterated milk or milk to 11 which water or any foreign substance has been added, or 12 milk produced from sick or diseased cows, or milk in or from 13 cans or other utensils that are not in a clean or sanitary con-14 dition, or as pure milk, milk from which the cream or a 15 part thereof has been removed; and whoever by himself, 16 clerk, servant or agent, sells, exchanges or delivers or has 17 in his custody or possession with intent to sell, exchange 18 or deliver, cream containing less than eighteen per cent of 19 milk fat, shall for a first offence be punished by a fine not 20 exceeding fifty dollars, for a second offence by a fine of 21 not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dollars and 22 for a subsequent offence by a fine of one hundred dollars 23 and by imprisonment for not less than thirty nor more than 24 sixty days.'

Said section is further amended by adding to it the follow-26 ing: 'Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit 27 the sale of skim-milk as such'; so that the section as amend-28 ed shall read as follows:

'Sect. 3. Whoever by himself, clerk, servant or agent, 30 sells, exchanges or delivers, or has in his custody or posses-31 sion with intent to sell, exchange or deliver or exposes or 32 offers for sale or exchange, adulterated milk or milk to 33 which water or any foreign substance has been added, or 34 milk produced from sick or diseased cows, or milk in or 35 from cans or other utensils that are not in a clean or sani-

36 tary condition, or as pure milk, milk from which the cream 37 or a part thereof has been removed; and whoever by him-38 self, clerk, servant or agent, sells, exchanges or delivers 39 or has in his custody or possession with intent to sell, ex-40 change or deliver, cream containing less than eighteen per 41 cent of milk fat, shall for a first offence be punished by a 42 fine not exceeding fifty dollars, for a second offence by a 43 fine of not less than fifty nor more than one hundred dol-44 lars and for a subsequent offence by a fine of one hundred 45 dollars and by imprisonment for not less than thirty nor 46 more than sixty days. When milk shall, by analysis, be 47 found to contain over eighty-eight and one-fourth per cent 48 of water or less than eight and one-half per cent of solids 49 exclusive of fat, it shall be deemed prima facie evidence 50 that said milk has been watered, and when milk, by analysis, 51 shall be found to contain less than eleven and three-fourths 52 per cent of solids and less than three and one-fourth per 53 cent of fat, it shall be deemed prima facie milk from which 54 cream has been taken, and any milk which, by analysis, 55 shall be found to contain any foreign substance, shall be 56 deemed milk to which a foreign substance has been added.

'Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the 58 sale of skim-milk as such.'
