STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section sixty-two of Chapter forty-eight of
the Public Laws of 1905 relating to Free High Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 62 of Chapter 48 of the Public Laws
2 of 1905 is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

‘Sect. 62. Any town which does not maintain a free
4 high school of standard grade may from year to year au-
5 thorize its superintending school committee to contract with
6 and pay the trustees of any academy in said town, or the
7 trustees of any academy or the superintending school com-
8 mittee in any adjoining town, for the tuition of scholars
9 within such academy or adjoining town in the studies con-
10 templated by the seven preceding sections under a standard

11 of scholarship to be approved by the joint committee here-
12 inafter named; and when such contract has been made, three
13 members of the superintending school committee of each
14 such town and three members of the board of trustees of
15 such academy, so contracting, shall be a joint committee for
16 the selection of all teachers, for the management and disci-
17 pline of the scholars, and the arranging of the course of
18 study in such academy or free high school, when such acad-
19 emy has an endowment of less than ten thousand dollars;
20 and the expenditure of any town for tuition in such acad-
21 emy or free high school shall entitle such town to the same
22 state aid as if it had made such expenditure for the main-
23 tenance of a free high school within such town.'
