STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Chapter eighty-eight of the Public Laws of
nineteen hundred and seven (as amended by Chapter one hun-
dred and thirty-eight of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred
and nine) as follows:

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Strike out

“Section 7. The marking of historical sites, as authorized
3 by the Legislature, shall be under the direction of the state
4 historian.” And inserting the following:

‘Section 7. The marking of historical sites, authorized by
6 the Legislature, shall be under the direction of a historical
7 commission, serving without pay, and consisting of five

8 members appointed by the Governor, of whom the state his-
9 torian shall be one. In marking such sites the commission
10 shall have regard to the character of the memorial and also
11 to the inscription to be placed upon it, and no money shall
12 be paid for the memorial by the state treasurer unless said
13 memorial and its inscription shall receive the approval of the
14 commission.'
