## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter one hundred thirtysix of the Revised Statutes relating to sentence in criminal cases.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Section I of Chapter one hundred and thirty-

- 2 six of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking
- 3 out the words "When it is provided that he shall be pun-
- 4 ished by imprisonment and fine, or by imprisonment or fine,
- 5 or by fine and in addition thereto imprisonment, he may be
- 6 sentenced to either or both," so that said section as amended
- 7 shall read as follows:

'Section 1. No person shall be punished for an offence un-

9 til convicted thereof in a court having jurisdiction of the 10 person and case. When no punishment is provided by stat11 ute, a person convicted of an offence shall be imprisoned for 12 less than one year or fined not exceeding five hundred dol13 lars. In all cases where a fine is imposed he may be sen14 tenced to pay the costs of prosecution; and for violations of 15 sections forty-one, forty-two, forty-four, forty-nine and fif16 ty-four of chapter twenty-nine, he shall be sentenced to pay 17 such costs.'
