STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to consolidate the management of State Institution
for the Insane and Feeble Minded.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 1 of Chapter 144 of the Revised Statutes relative to Insane Hospitals and the first two paragraphs of Section 2 of Chapter 144 of the Public Laws of 1907, relative to the Maine School for Feeble Minded, are hereby repealed and the offices of trustees of said institutions, created by said Sections, are hereby declared vacant.

Sect. 2. The governor shall with the advice of the council appoint one board of four trustees, of said institutions, all of whom shall be inhabitants of this state, and one of

4 whom shall be a woman. The woman first appointed shall
5 serve for five years, and the term of the other trustees first
6 appointed shall be fixed at three, two and one years, re-
7 spectively. All trustees thereafter appointed shall serve for
8 four years. The governor shall be a member of said board
9 of ex-officers.

Sect. 3. Said board shall be known as "Hospital Trus-
2 tees." They shall have the government of the Maine In-
3 sane Hospital at Augusta, the Eastern Maine Insane Hos-
4 pital at Bangor, and the Maine School for Feeble Minded
5 at Pownal.

Sect. 4. Said board of "Hospital Trustees" shall perform
2 all the duties required, and have all the powers given by
3 Statute to the Trustees of Insane Hospitals and to the
4 Trustees of the School for the Feebled Minded.

Sect. 5. Said Hospital Trustees shall receive no com-
2 pensation except actual expenses.

Sect. 6. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith
2 are hereby repealed.
