STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Chapter 360 of the Special and Private Laws of 1909 to regulate fishing on the Bagaduce River in the towns of Castine, Penobscot and Brooksville in the county of Hancock.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section I. That the ninth word in the second line of
Chapter 360 of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen
hundred and nine shall be changed to "Herring." And when
amended shall read as follows:

'Section I. No person shall use any weir, sein, trap or 6 any other contrivance in catching, fishing for or taking 7 herring in the Bagaduce River or any of its tributaries, in 8 the towns of Castine, Penobscot and Brooksville in the 9 county of Hancock, except by the use of gill nets and 10 permanent weirs, with not less than fifty poles, constructed 11 of laths, brush wire or twine.'
