

STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to provide for the distribution of the school mill fund and the common school fund and to amend Sections 122, 123 and 126 of Chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes, and Section 3 of Chapter 177 of the Public Laws of 1909, relating to distribution of the common school fund.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. On or before August first, 1911, and on or 2 before August first annually thereafter, the superintendent 3 of schools of each town shall make under oath, a full and 4 complete return to the state superintendent of public schools 5 of the school attendance in his town for the school year end- 6 ing July first next preceding.

Sect. 2. It shall be the duty of the state superintendent of

2 public schools to prepare and furnish to the superintendent
3 of schools of towns such blanks as he deems proper to se-
4 cure full returns required under section 1 of this act.

Sect. 3. The treasurer of state shall immediately after the
2 first day of November, 1911, and annually thereafter, ap-
3 portion to the towns the school mill and common school
4 funds on the basis of average school attendance for the
5 school year ending July first next preceding, as furnished
6 by the state superintendent of public schools. For the pur-
7 pose of such distribution average school attendance shall be
8 computed for all persons under twenty-one years of age
9 attending any educational institution within the state, and
10 the apportionment for each pupil shall be made to the town
11 of which he is a resident.

Sect. 4. Section 122 of chapter fifteen of the Revised
2 Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words “num-
3 ber of children therein, between five and twenty-one years
4 of age” in the twelfth and thirteenth lines thereof and in-
5 serting in place thereof the words ‘average school attend-
6 ance of pupils resident therein,’ so that said section as
7 amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 122. The treasurer of state shall keep a separate
9 account of all moneys received from sales of lands appro-
10 priated for the support of schools or from notes taken there-
11 for, and of any other moneys appropriated for the same pur-
12 pose; and such sums shall constitute a permanent school
13 fund, which may be put at interest as the Legislature di-

14 refts. A sum equal to six per cent of the amount of such
15 fund, and one-half the sum received by the state from the
16 tax on the franchises of savings banks, and one-half the
17 sum assessed upon the deposits of trust and banking com-
18 panies, shall be annually appropriated to the support of com-
19 mon schools, and distributed among the several towns ac-
20 cording to the average school attendance of pupils resident
21 therein.'

Sect. 5. Section 123 of chapter fifteen of the Revised
2 Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the word "July"
3 in the first line and inserting in place thereof the word 'No-
4 vember,' also by striking out the words "list of children"
5 in the third line and inserting in place thereof the words
6 'average school attendance as'; also by striking out the
7 words from "as provided" in the fourth line, to and in-
8 cluding the word "apportionment" in the tenth line, so that
9 said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 123. The treasurer shall, immediately after the first
11 day of November apportion to the towns all the state school
12 funds for the year, according to the average school attend-
13 ance as furnished by the state superintendent of public
14 schools. Immediately after making the apportionment, the
15 treasurer shall notify each town of its proportion; which
16 shall not be paid to any town until its returns, both common
17 school and fiscal, are made to the state superintendent of
18 public schools, nor so long as any state tax assessed upon
19 such town remains unpaid.'

Sect. 6. Section 126 of chapter fifteen of the Revised

2 Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words “num-
3 ber of scholars” in the third line and inserting in place there-
4 of ‘average school attendance of pupils resident,’ so that
5 said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 126. This fund shall be distributed by the treasurer
7 of state on the first day of January, annually to the several
8 cities, towns and plantations according to the average school
9 attendance of pupils therein, as the same shall appear from
10 the official returns made to the state superintendent of pub-
11 lic schools for the preceding year.’

Sect. 7. Section three of chapter 177 of the Public Laws
2 of 1909 is hereby amended by striking out the words “one-
3 third” in the first line; also by striking out the words “num-
4 ber of scholars” in the fourth line and inserting in place
5 thereof the words ‘average school attendance of pupils resi-
6 dent therein’; also by striking the words from “and the re-
7 maining two-thirds” in the sixth line to and including the
8 word “year” in the tenth line; so that said section as amend-
9 ed shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 3. This fund shall be distributed by the treasurer
11 of state on the first day of January, annually, to the several
12 cities, towns and plantations according to the average school
13 attendance of pupils resident therein, as the same shall ap-
14 pear from the official returns made to the state superin-
15 tendent of public schools for the preceding year.’
