STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to appropriate moneys for the expenditures of government for the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

Whereas, the appropriation of moneys for the maintenance of the several branches of the state government and its institutions is an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, now therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. In order to provide for the several acts and re-2 solves of the legislature requiring the payment of money 3 from the state treasury, and also to provide in part for the 4 necessary expenditures of government, for the current fiscal 5 year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, the following 6 sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state 7 treasury, and, except where otherwise specially provided, 8 the governor with the advice and consent of the council, is 9 hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day of July, 10 one thousand nine hundred and twelve, to draw his warrant 11 on the state treasurer for the same.
