STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and thirty-eight of the
Public Laws of nineteen hundred and nine relating to the
marking of historical sites.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 7 of Chapter 138 of the Public Laws of
2 1909 is hereby amended by striking out the section and in-
3 serting in place thereof the following:

‘Sect. 7. The marking of historical sites, authorized by the
5 Legislature, shall be under the direction of a Historical Com-
6 mission, serving without pay, and consisting of five mem-
7 bers appointed by the Governor, of whom the State Historian
8 shall be one. In marking such sites the Commission shall

9 have regard to the character of the memorial and also to the
10 inscription to be placed upon it, and no money shall be paid
11 for the memorial by the State Treasurer unless said memo-
12 rial and its inscription shall receive the approval of the Com-
13 mission.'
