STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to limit the number of fish which may be taken in one day in certain tributaries to Wilson Lake, which lake is situated in the town of Wilton, also in Alder Brook, a tributary to Weld Pond, which pond is situated in the town of Weld, down as far as Hildreth's Mill Dam, so called, all in the County of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, 2 catch or kill more than twenty-five fish in all in any one day 3 in any of the tributaries to Wilson lake, which lake is situ- 4 ated in the town of Wilton, county of Franklin, in which 5 fishing is now permitted by law, or in Alder brook, so called, 6 a tributary to Weld pond, which pond is situated in the town

7 of Weld, in the county of Franklin, down as far as Hil-
8 dretth's Mill dam, so called. It shall also be unlawful to
9 have in possession any fish taken in violation of this section.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general
3 law of the state for the illegal taking, catching or killing of
4 trout or landlocked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act municipi-
2 pal and police courts and trial justices within their respective
3 counties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent
4 jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts,
5 and all fines, forfeitures and penalties recovered by any per-
6 son for any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by
7 the person receiving the same to the state treasurer.
