## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT requiring street railroad companies to equip cars with fenders.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 1. No street railroad company shall after Septem2 ber first, nineteen hundred and eleven, run or operate cars
3 through any streets of any city or town unless the same are
4 equipped with suitable fenders of such type as shall be ap5 proved by the railroad commissioners or any other commis6 sioners who may hereafter be elected or appointed to per7 form the principal duties now performed by the railroad
8 commissioners.

Sect. 2. Any company violating the provisions of this act 2 shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one hundred

3 dollars nor more than five hundred dollars for each day such 4 car is so run or operated, to be recovered by indictment for 5 the use of the city or town in which the offense is com-6 mitted.
