STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE

AN ACT requiring street railroad companies to equip cars with
fenders.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No street railroad company shall after September first, nineteen hundred and eleven, run or operate cars through any streets of any city or town unless the same are equipped with suitable fenders of such type as shall be approved by the railroad commissioners or any other commissioners who may hereafter be elected or appointed to perform the principal duties now performed by the railroad commissioners.

Sect. 2. Any company violating the provisions of this act shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one hundred

3 dollars nor more than five hundred dollars for each day such
4 car is so run or operated, to be recovered by indictment for
5 the use of the city or town in which the offense is com-
